<p><u>Tenkara Casting :</u></p> <p>Tenkara places more emphasis on technique rather than gear. Tenkara fishing can be seen as a streamlined counterpart to western fly-fishing. The equipment is designed to direct focus to the actual fishing and catching of the fish, not to cause a major preoccupation with the equipment.
